Snave attended Lincoln Grade School and Everett High School (completing her studies in a three year accelerated course).

A devoted Cougar, Snave went to Washington State University where she excelled in all areas. She received a teaching degree, going on in later years to pick up two Masters Degrees. She won many honors, among which was membership in Phi Kappa Phi, national scholastic honorary.

She started her teaching career in Stevenson, Washington, then on to White Salmon. She taught at WSU, but her true love was teaching at the high school level. In 1945 she moved to Snohomish and taught for almost 10 years, then on to Everett High School and Cascade High School. Her career spanned an amazing 47 years.

Snave was degreed in public school music. She was the leader of Acapella, Chordettes, and Seagals Drill Team at Everett High. She directed a number of first rate musicals, including Brigadoon (her favorite), Oklahoma, South Pacific, Annie Get Your Gun, Wonderful Town, and The King and I, and more.

Snave loved cars (fast red ones), all sports, golf, tennis, basketball. Snave loved her friends, Wilma Tempero, Ethel Smith, Pam Wilkins and many others. But above all else, Snave loved her "kids". The hundreds of lives which were developed because of her expectations and sincere caring were always close to her heart.
